Learning objective: To understand how goods are traded around the world and how they reach our shops.

When a country buys items from another country, it is called an import. When a country sells items to another country, it is called an export. This buying and selling is called trade.

7. 7. Look at the price of an apple. If an apple costs 30p and you buy 5 apples, how much do you spend in total? (5 marks) (5 marks)
