Learning objective: To show what you have learned about life in Ancient Egypt.

5. What was the job of a scribe in Ancient Egypt? Use a full sentence. (2 marks)

6. Imagine you lived in Ancient Egypt. Would you rather be a farmer or a scribe? Explain your choice. (3 marks)

7. 7. Extended Writing: Write a short story (4-5 sentences) about a day in the life of an Ancient Egyptian. Think about what they eat, what they wear, and the work they do. (5 marks)
