- Armstrong and his fellow astronaut, Buzz Aldrin, spent over two hours exploring the moon's surface and collecting lunar rock samples.

Did you know? Did you know? Neil Armstrong carried a small piece of wood from the propeller of the Wright brothers' 1903 aircraft with him to the moon! It was a special tribute to the very first powered flight on Earth.
