Why do we wear poppies?

To show respect for soldiers who served in wars.

What happened on 11th November 1918?

The fighting in the First World War ended.

What is the 'Armistice'?

A formal agreement to stop fighting in a war.

How many minutes of silence are often held?

Two minutes of silence.

Why do we have a silence?

To have quiet time to think and show respect.

What does 'Peace' mean?

A time when there is no war or fighting.

Who is the person that helps us learn history?

Ellie the Elephant loves to share stories about the past.
