

Learning about the Past: The Abolition of Slavery

Learning objective: To understand that slavery existed in the past and to recognise the brave people who worked to end it.

Read the questions carefully. Use the word bank to help you complete the sentences. You can use the sentence starters to help you write your answers.

In history, many people were treated unfairly and were made to work without any pay or choice. These people were called enslaved people. Over time, brave people started a movement to stop this. This movement was called the Abolition. It meant they wanted to stop slavery forever so that everyone could live with freedom and fairness.

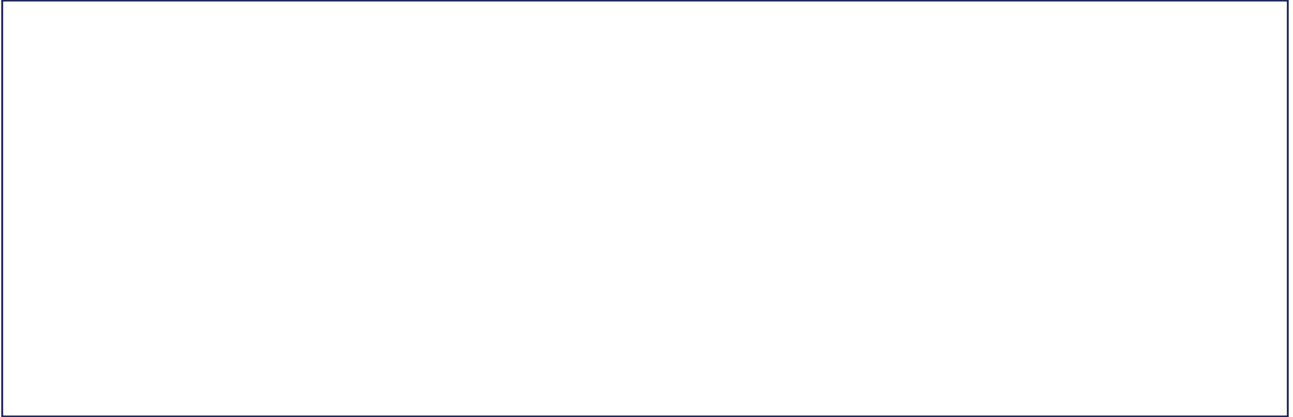
1. What does the word 'enslaved' mean? Use the sentence starter: An enslaved person is someone who... (2 marks)
