

My Tudor Home Drawing Sheet

Learning objective: To identify and draw the key features of a Tudor house.

Follow the steps below to build your Tudor house drawing. Use the word bank to help you label your picture.

Draw: Draw a large Tudor cottage in the centre of the page. Use a black felt-tip pen to draw thick vertical and horizontal lines for the timber frame. Fill the square gaps between the beams with light brown or grey colour to represent the wattle and daub. Add a thick, yellow-coloured thatched roof on top. Include a tall stone chimney on the side.



Label words: Thatch · Timber frame · Wattle and daub · Stone chimney

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a house with a steep roof. Label the straw roof material.
2. Step 2: Draw dark wooden beams in a cross pattern on the walls. Label these as timber.
3. Step 3: Draw a large chimney on the side of the house. Label the material.
4. Step 4: Ellie the Elephant says Tudor walls were made of mud and sticks. Label the wall space between the beams.
