

Max's Magnificent Measurements

Get Ready to Measure with Max the Monkey!

- Length and height tell us how long or tall an object is. We can measure these using a ruler in centimetres (cm).
- Weight tells us how heavy something is. We use scales to find out if an object is heavier or lighter.
- Capacity is how much a container can hold. We can measure liquid using millilitres (ml) or litres (l).
- Non-standard units like paperclips, cubes, or handprints can help us compare the size of two items.
- Always start measuring from the zero mark on your ruler to get the correct length.
- When using balance scales, the side that goes down is the heavier side!

Did you know? Did you know? Max the Monkey uses his tail to measure how tall the jungle trees are! Sometimes he uses cubes, and sometimes he uses a ruler to get the exact measurement in centimetres.
