

Max's Place Value Adventure!

Max the monkey is here to help you solve the puzzle of numbers! Look at the place of each digit to find its true value.

- The Thousands column is the fourth place from the right. If you have 5 in this column, it is worth 5,000.
- The Hundreds column is the third place from the right. A digit here tells us how many groups of 100 we have.
- The Tens column is the second place from the right. It shows us how many groups of 10 are hidden inside the number.
- The Ones column is the first place on the right. This is where we count single units from 1 to 9.
- If a column is empty, we use a zero as a place holder to keep the other digits in their correct homes.

Did you know? Did you know? In the number 1,234, the digit '1' is worth one thousand, but in the number 4,321, that same '1' is only worth one single one!
