

Year 4 PSHE Assessment: Being a Good Friend

Learning objective: To understand the qualities of positive friendships and how to solve problems with friends.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you need help. Write your answers in the boxes provided.

Leo the Lion and his friend Pip the Caterpillar are best friends. They have lots of fun, but sometimes they disagree. When they have a problem, they talk about it calmly. They always try to be kind to each other.

1. Name two things that make a good friend. (2 marks)

2. Leo and Pip have a disagreement about which game to play. What is the first thing they should do to solve this? (3 marks)

3. Why is it important to say 'sorry' if you hurt a friend's feelings? (3 marks)

4. Imagine your friend is feeling sad because they lost their favourite pencil. Write two ways you could help them feel better. (4 marks)

5. Write a short story or letter (4-5 sentences) about a time you showed kindness to a friend. Use these sentence starters: One day my friend was... I decided to... This made my friend feel... We were happy because... (13 marks)
