

Staying Safe Online with Kit the Fox

Learning objective: To understand that we should only use the internet with a trusted adult and to recognise that not everything we see or hear online is true or safe.

Help Kit the Fox learn how to be a smart explorer on the computer. Read each question carefully and talk to your grown-up about your answers.

Word bank: Trusted adult · Screen · Password · Private · Help · Kind

1. Kit the Fox is playing a game on a tablet. Who should he ask before he starts a new game or clicks on a link? (2 marks)

2. If a game pops up and asks for your real name or where you live, what should you do? Tell us why. (2 marks)

3. Imagine you see something on the screen that makes you feel sad, scared, or worried. What is the very first thing you should do? (2 marks)

4. Why is it important to be kind to people when we are talking to them through a computer screen? (2 marks)

5. Draw a circle around the people who are 'Trusted Adults' you can talk to if you are worried about something you saw online. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself and Kit the Fox sitting together using a tablet safely. Make sure you draw a grown-up nearby too!



Extension challenge: Create a 'Safety Poster' for your classroom. Draw three golden rules for using the computer, such as 'Ask first', 'Stay kind', and 'Tell an adult'.
