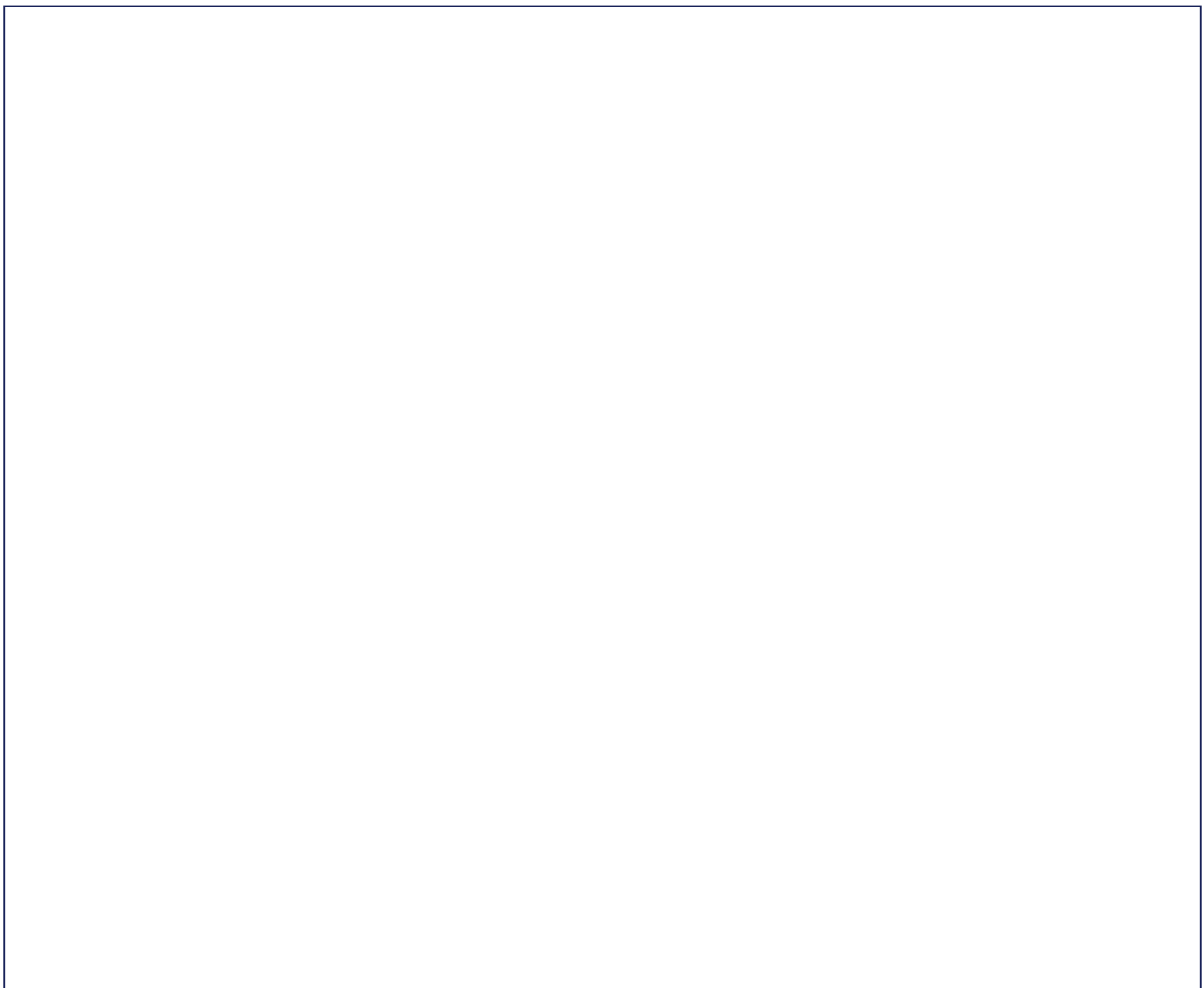


Nova's Bright Bonfire Night

Learning objective: To understand the traditions of Bonfire Night and develop fine motor skills through guided drawing and labelling.

Help Nova the owl draw a beautiful Bonfire Night scene. Use the word bank to label your picture, and answer the questions below to show what you know about staying safe.

Draw: Draw a nighttime garden scene. In the centre, draw a large pile of logs with orange and yellow flames rising up to make a bonfire. Above the fire, draw colourful, star-shaped fireworks exploding in the sky. In the corner, draw Nova the owl wearing a warm scarf, watching the sky safely from a distance. Use bright colours like yellow, red, and gold for the light, and dark blue or black for the sky.



Label words: sparkler · firework · bonfire · glow · night sky

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large, warm bonfire in the middle of your page. Why do we keep a safe distance from the fire?
2. Step 2: Draw a bright sparkler in a hand. Who should always hold a sparkler for you?
3. Label your drawing using at least three words from the word bank provided.
4. What colours would you use to make the fireworks look bright against the dark night sky?

5. If you bought a glow-stick for £1, how many £1 coins would you need to pay for it?
