

Christianity: Beliefs and Traditions

Learning objective: To show understanding of key Christian beliefs, the importance of the Bible, and how Christians celebrate special times.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you with your answers. Write your answers in the boxes provided.

Christians believe in one God. They follow the teachings of Jesus. The holy book for Christians is called the Bible. Christians often go to a building called a church to pray and sing. They celebrate Christmas to remember the birth of Jesus and Easter to remember his life.
