Learning objective: To identify key beliefs, symbols, and practices within Christianity as part of Year 4 Religious Education.

2. 2. True or False: Christians believe that God is one, but revealed in three persons (the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit). (1 mark)

3. 3. What is the specific term used to describe the Christian belief in the three-in-one nature of God? (1 mark)

4. 4. Who do Christians believe is the Son of God? A) Moses, B) Jesus*, C) David, D) Noah (1 mark)

5. 5. True or False: Christmas is the festival that celebrates the resurrection of Jesus. (1 mark)

6. 6. Which major Christian festival commemorates the day Christians believe Jesus rose from the dead? (1 mark)

7. 7. In one sentence, explain the primary purpose of a church building. (1 mark)

8. 8. True or False: Many Christians believe that prayer is a way to communicate directly with God. (1 mark)

9. 9. How many 'Gospels' (the books telling the life of Jesus) are found at the beginning of the New Testament? (1 mark)

10. 10. What is the act of being welcomed into the Christian community, often involving water, called? (1 mark)
