

Learning about Eid-ul-Fitr

Learning objective: To understand the meaning and traditions of Eid-ul-Fitr for Muslims.

Eid-ul-Fitr is a special festival. It happens after a month called Ramadan. During Ramadan, many Muslims spend time fasting, which means they do not eat or drink while the sun is up. When the new moon is seen, Eid begins. People go to the mosque for prayers. They wear new clothes and share meals with their family and friends. It is also a time to give money to people who need help.
