

Learning About Islam: Assessment for Year 4

Learning objective: To show understanding of the key beliefs, practices, and traditions within Islam.

Islam is a religion followed by people all over the world. Muslims believe in one God, who is called Allah. Their holy book is called the Quran. Muslims often go to a place of worship called a mosque. They follow five important rules, known as the Five Pillars, which guide how they live their lives.

5. Why is the city of Makkah important to Muslims? (3 marks)

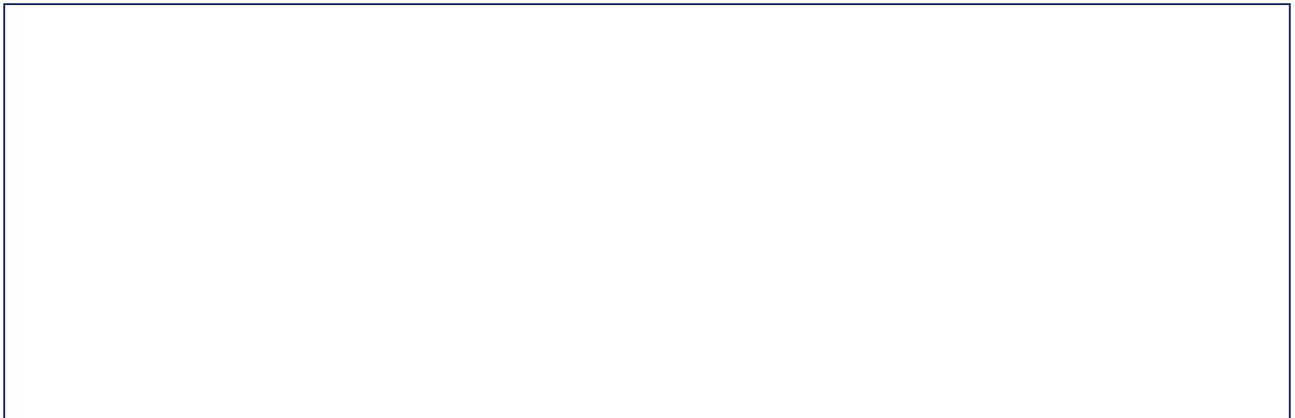
6. List two of the Five Pillars of Islam and explain what they mean in your own words. (4 marks)
