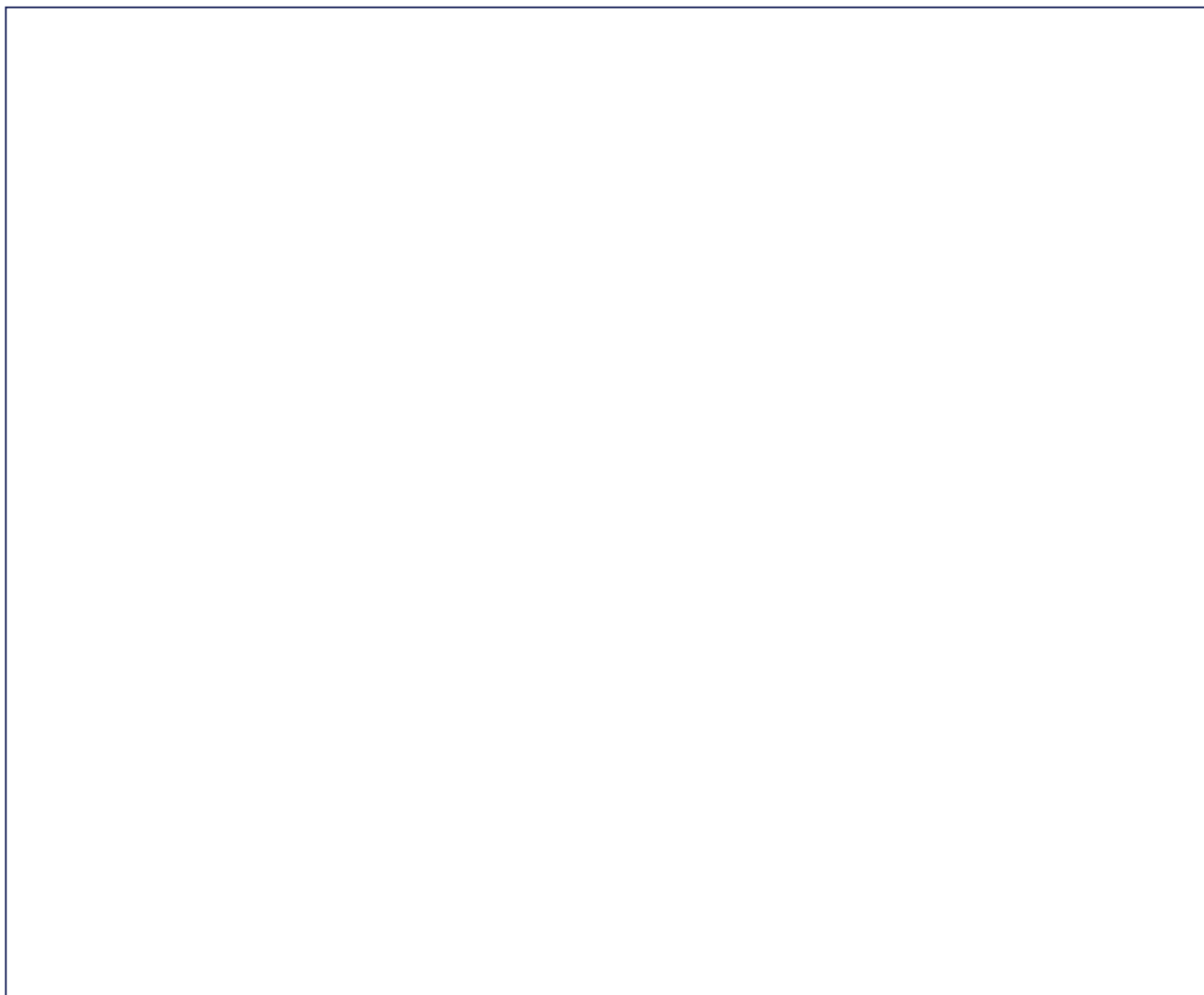


Reflecting on Beliefs: Life After Death

Learning objective: To understand that different religions have diverse beliefs about life after death and to represent these concepts visually.

Use the drawing area to create a piece of art that represents a belief about what happens after life. Think about the symbols and metaphors used by different faiths, such as a journey, a garden, or a state of peace. Use your labels to explain why you chose these symbols.

Draw: Draw a scene that represents the concept of a 'journey' or 'new beginning'. Use warm colours if you are representing a peaceful place, or natural elements like rivers, paths, or stars to show a transition. You may include Nova the owl watching from a branch to show a sense of calm observation.

Steps:

1. Identify one religion that believes in reincarnation and briefly describe what that means.
2. Why do many people find comfort in believing in an afterlife? Explain your answer.
3. Step 1: Draw a symbol in the centre of your page that represents 'peace' or 'eternal life' to you.
4. Step 2: Label your drawing using at least three words from the word bank.
5. Step 3: Write one sentence at the bottom of your page explaining how memories of a loved one can feel

like a form of life after death.
