

Exploring Prayer with Pip

Learning objective: To understand what prayer is and why people choose to pray.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you complete your sentences. Pip the caterpillar is here to help you think about quiet moments.

Word bank: Thank · Sorry · Quiet · Talk · God · Help

1. Pip likes to sit in a quiet garden to think. Why do you think people choose to pray in a quiet place? (2 marks)

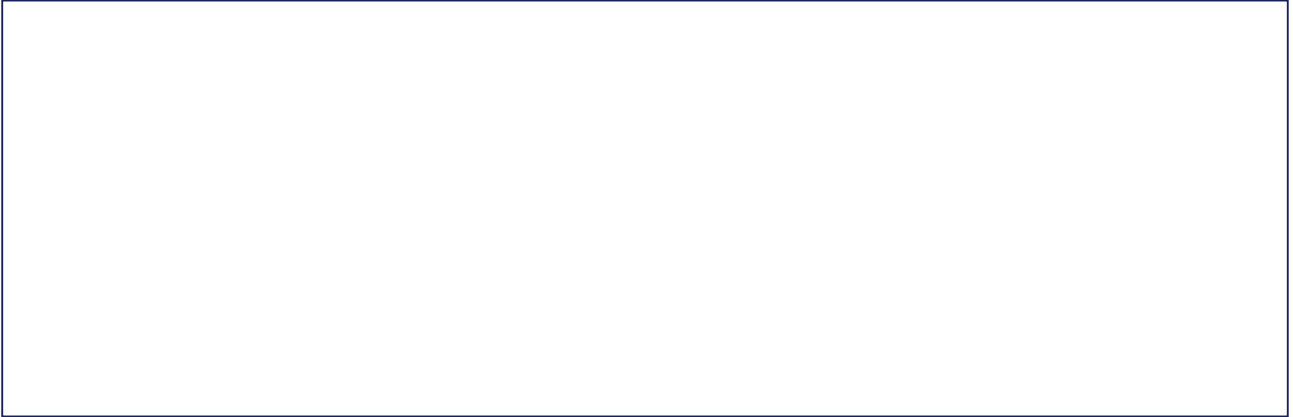
2. Many people pray to say thank you for things. Name two things you might say thank you for. (2 marks)

3. Sometimes, people pray to ask for help. Complete this sentence: 'I would pray to ask for help if I felt...' (1 mark)

4. If you were writing a prayer to say sorry, what might you say? (2 marks)

5. Does everyone pray in the same way? Write 'Yes' or 'No' and tell me one way a person might pray (for example: kneeling, sitting, or singing). (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of a peaceful place where you would feel calm enough to sit and think or pray. Include Pip the caterpillar sitting nearby.



Extension challenge: Write a short 'Thank You' prayer using three sentences. Start your first sentence with: 'Dear God, thank you for...'
