

Remembering with Pip and Leo

Learning objective: To understand why we observe Remembrance Day and the significance of the poppy as a symbol of peace.

Read the questions with an adult and talk about what it means to be kind and remember those who helped us. Write or draw your answers in the boxes provided.

Pip the caterpillar and Leo the lion are learning about Remembrance Day. They know it is a special time to say 'thank you' to the people who kept us safe. They see red poppies growing in the fields and remember to be kind to everyone.

Word bank: Poppy · Peace · Red · Remember · Respect · Kindness

1. What colour is the poppy that Pip and Leo see? (1 mark)

2. Why do we wear a poppy on Remembrance Day? Think about the word 'remember'. (2 marks)

3. Can you name one way you can show 'kindness' to a friend today? (2 marks)

4. If a poppy costs £1, and you have a £2 coin, how much money do you have left after buying one? (2 marks)

5. Leo the lion likes to write poetry. Can you think of one word that describes how we feel when we remember people who were brave? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a beautiful red poppy flower in the garden next to Pip the caterpillar.



Extension challenge: Talk to your family about someone in your life who is special to you. Draw a picture of them and write their name, or ask an adult to help you write a 'thank you' note to them.
