

Remembrance Day Assessment

Learning objective: To understand the significance of Remembrance Day and why we remember those who served in wars.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you with your spelling. Write your answers in the boxes provided.

Remembrance Day is held on the 11th of November. It marks the end of the First World War. At 11 o'clock, many people stand in silence for two minutes. This shows respect for the soldiers who gave their lives to help others. The red poppy is a symbol we wear to remember them.

1. On what date do we mark Remembrance Day? (1 mark)

2. Why do people wear a red poppy? Use the word bank to help you. (2 marks)

3. What happens at 11 o'clock on Remembrance Day? (2 marks)

4. Max the monkey is thinking about peace. Why is peace important for the world? (3 marks)

5. Ellie the elephant is learning about history. Write a short paragraph about why it is important for us to remember the soldiers who fought in wars. You could start with: 'We remember soldiers because...' (5 marks)
