Learning objective: To understand why we celebrate Remembrance Day and why we use symbols to show respect.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you write your answers. Leo the Lion is here to help you think about why we remember.

Word bank: Poppy · Respect · Peace · Soldiers · November · Silence

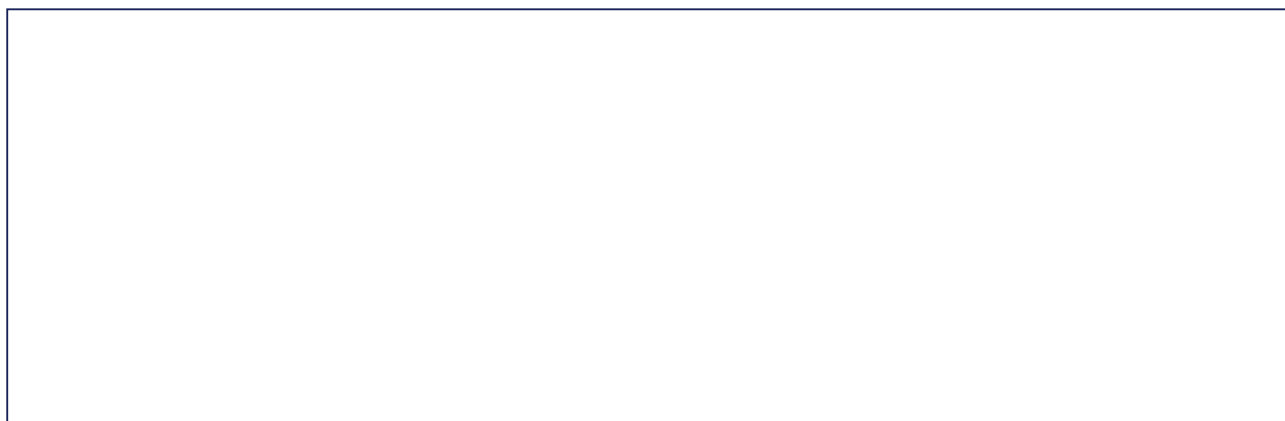
1. Leo the Lion says we wear a special red flower on our clothes in November. What is the name of this flower? (1 mark)
