

Mapping the Journey: The Human Digestive System

Learning objective: To identify and label the main parts of the human digestive system and describe their functions.

Use the diagram space below to draw the digestive system inside a simple outline of a human body. Follow the steps provided to ensure all key organs are included and labelled correctly.

Draw: Draw a clear, front-facing outline of a human torso. Inside the torso, sketch the digestive tract starting from the mouth and ending at the rectum. Use simple, bold lines. Use different colours for each organ to make the pathway clear. Ensure the small intestine is drawn as a tight, coiled structure and the large intestine is shown as a thicker frame around it.



Label words: Mouth · Oesophagus · Stomach · Small intestine · Large intestine · Rectum

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw the oesophagus as a tube connecting the mouth to the stomach. Label it.
2. Step 2: Draw the stomach as a J-shaped bag. Label it.
3. Step 3: Draw the long, coiled tube representing the small intestine and label it.
4. Step 4: Draw the wider, outer tube of the large intestine surrounding the small intestine and label it.
5. Explain in one sentence what happens to food in the stomach.
