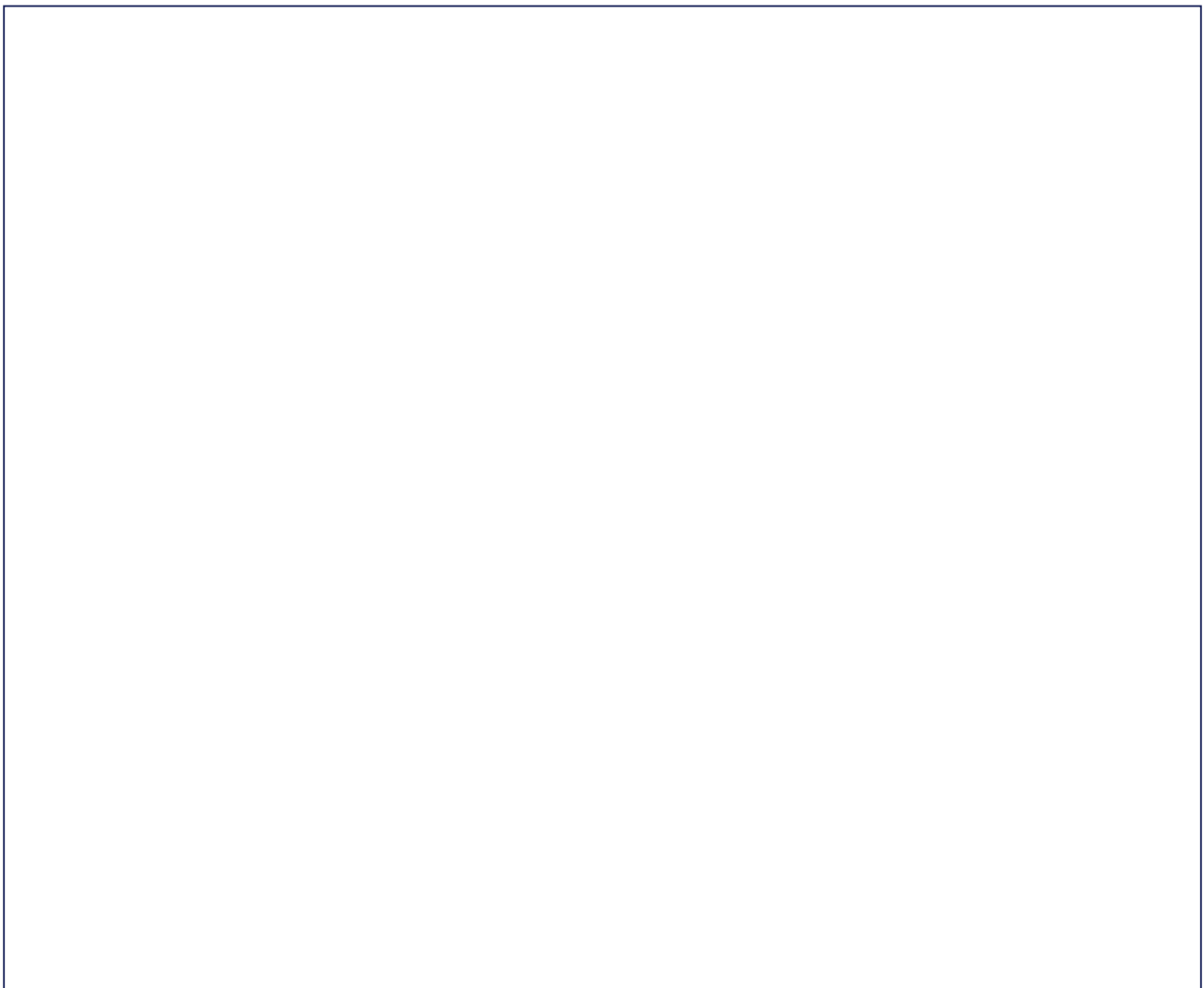


Nova's Woodland Habitat Discovery

Learning objective: To identify and label the key features of a woodland habitat and understand how plants and animals live there.

Follow the steps to build your woodland scene. Use the word bank to help you label your drawing. You can colour your picture when you have finished.

Draw: Draw a woodland scene. Use a landscape orientation. Include a large, leafy tree as the centrepiece. Ensure the roots are visible under the ground and show a small animal hole (burrow) at the base. Add a layer of brown, crunchy-looking leaves on the forest floor. Add a tiny beetle or ant near the leaves. Add rays of golden sunlight shining down through the branches.



Label words: tree · burrow · leaf litter · sunlight · roots · insect

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large tree in the middle of your page. Draw some roots under the soil and a small burrow near the bottom. Label the 'roots' and the 'burrow'.
2. Step 2: Draw some dead leaves on the ground around the tree. This is called 'leaf litter'. Label the 'leaf litter'.
3. Step 3: Draw a small insect near the leaves. Label the 'insect'.

4. Step 4: Draw bright yellow lines coming from the top corner to show 'sunlight'. Label the 'sunlight'.
