

Nova's Human Body Discovery Sheet

Learning objective: To identify and label the basic parts of the human digestive system and their functions.

Follow the steps below to draw and label the inside of the human body. Use the word bank to help you label each part correctly. Take your time and use your best handwriting.

Draw: Draw a clear, simple diagram of a human torso. Use clean lines to show the digestive system: a tube for the oesophagus, a curved shape for the stomach, a coiled line for the small intestine, and a thicker, wider border for the large intestine. Keep the drawing neat and leave enough space around the parts to write your labels clearly.



Label words: mouth · oesophagus · stomach · small intestine · large intestine

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a simple outline of a person. Inside the body, draw the tube that carries food from the mouth to the stomach. Label this the 'oesophagus'.
2. Step 2: Draw a bag-like shape under the oesophagus where food is broken down. Label this the 'stomach'.
3. Step 3: Draw a long, thin, coiled tube connected to the stomach. Label this the 'small intestine'.
4. Step 4: Draw a wider tube around the small intestine. Label this the 'large intestine'.
