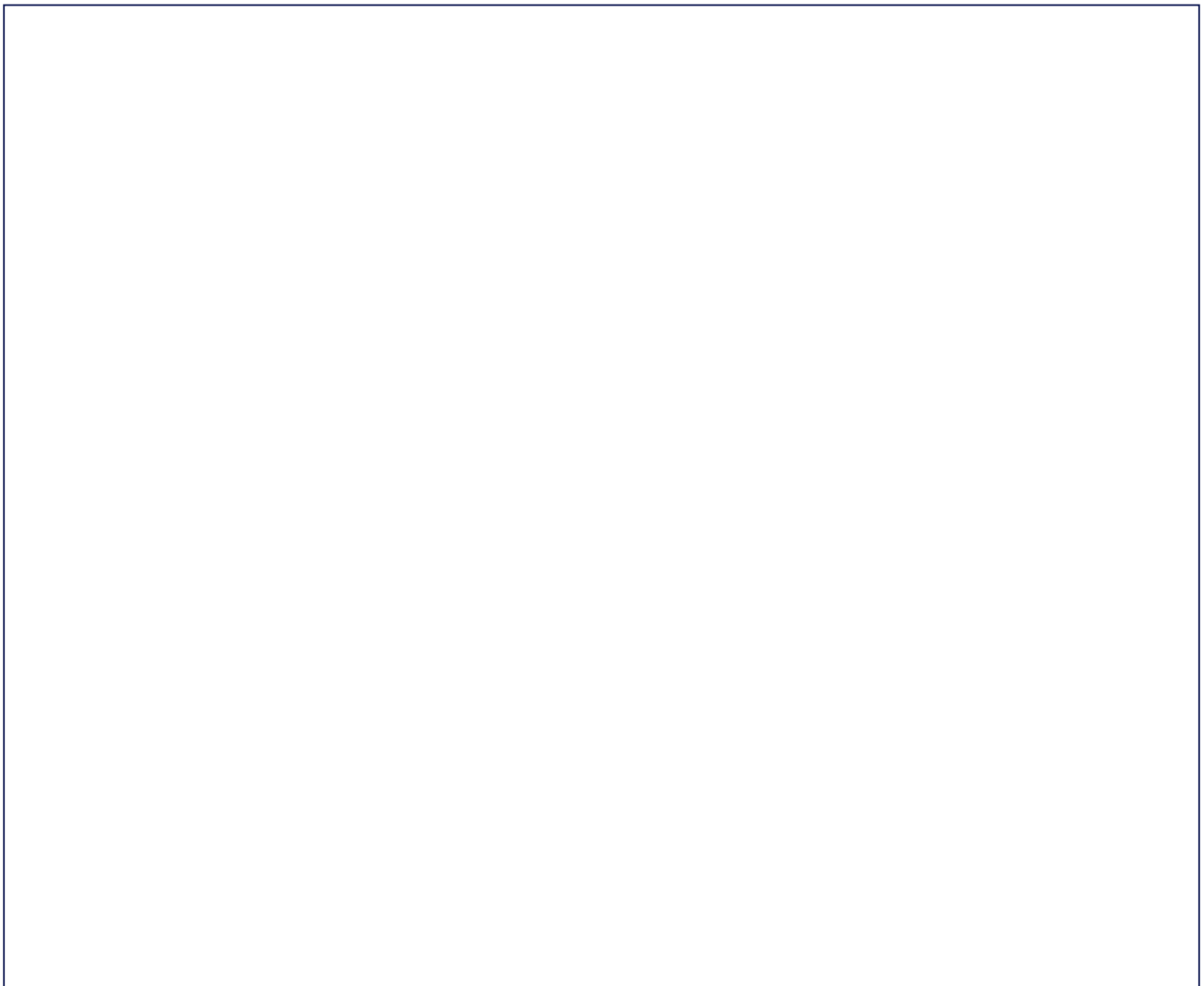


Bea's Tooth Investigation

Learning objective: To identify and label the different types of human teeth and describe their functions.

Follow the steps below to draw and label your diagram of human teeth. Use the word bank to help you label each part correctly.

Draw: Draw a clear, large diagram of the inside of a human mouth. Use a simple line-drawing style. Ensure the teeth are distinct shapes: flat at the front (incisors), pointed at the sides (canines), and broad/bumpy at the back (molars). Leave space around the drawing for labels.



Label words: Incisor · Canine · Molar · Gum

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large, simple shape of an open mouth showing the teeth inside. Label the pink part that holds the teeth in place as the 'Gum'.
2. Step 2: Draw four flat, sharp teeth at the very front of the mouth. Label these as 'Incisor'.
3. Step 3: Draw one pointed tooth next to the front teeth. Label this as 'Canine'.
4. Step 4: Draw wide, bumpy teeth at the back of the mouth. Label these as 'Molar'.
