

Bea's Brilliant Bite: Understanding Our Teeth

Learning objective: To identify and describe the functions of different types of human teeth in the digestive system.

Use the word bank to label the diagram of the human mouth. Then, follow the drawing prompt to complete your scientific illustration.

Draw: Draw a large, clear diagram of an open human mouth. Include the four main types of teeth: sharp, chisel-shaped incisors at the front; pointed canines; and flat, broad premolars and molars at the back. Use a pencil to sketch the shape of each tooth carefully. Add arrows pointing to each type of tooth so you can add your labels from the word bank. Ensure your drawing style is clear and scientific, like a page from a biology textbook.



Label words: Incisors · Canines · Premolars · Molars

Steps:

1. Label the teeth in the diagram above using the correct terms from the word bank.
2. Explain the role of incisors when eating an apple.
3. Why are molars important for the digestive process?
4. Which type of tooth is best for tearing food? Explain your answer.
