

Rosa's Spanish Body Parts Challenge

Learning objective: To identify, translate, and apply vocabulary related to parts of the human body in Spanish.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in the spaces provided. Use the word bank to help you with your spelling. Good luck!

Rosa the parrot is preparing for a dance show! She needs to make sure she can name all the parts of her body that move while she dances. Help Rosa identify the parts she is using in her routine.

Word bank: la cabeza · los hombros · las rodillas · los pies · los ojos · la nariz · la boca · las manos · los brazos

1. Translate the following body parts into Spanish: 1) Head, 2) Feet. (2 marks)

2. Rosa points to her eyes and her nose. Write these in Spanish using the correct articles (los/la). (2 marks)

3. If a dancer is waving, which body part are they using? Write the Spanish word. (1 mark)

4. Explain why it is important to use the correct article ('el', 'la', 'los', 'las') when describing body parts in Spanish. Provide an example. (4 marks)

5. Compare and contrast the Spanish words for 'knees' (las rodillas) and 'shoulders' (los hombros). How do the articles help us understand these words? (4 marks)

6. Rosa says, 'Toco mis rodillas' (I touch my knees). If you wanted to say 'I touch my head', how would you write that sentence in Spanish? (3 marks)

7. Extended Writing: Imagine you are a dance instructor like Rosa. Write a short sequence of 4 instructions in Spanish for a student, telling them which body parts to move (e.g., 'Touch your nose'). Explain why you chose those specific movements. (5 marks)

8. What might happen if you mixed up the masculine and feminine articles in a Spanish sentence? Justify why precision matters in language learning. (4 marks)

Draw: Draw a funny monster with three eyes, two noses, and four arms. Label each body part in Spanish using your word bank.
