

¡Mi Cuerpo! (My Body)

Join Rosa the parrot on a colourful journey to discover how to name your body parts in Spanish!

- **La cabeza** is the Spanish term for the head. Can you spot it at the top of your body?
- **Los ojos** help you to see, while **la boca** helps you to speak. Both are found on your face.
- You use your **brazos** and **manos** to reach for things, and your **piernas** and **pies** to walk to school.
- Notice that 'Los' and 'Las' are used when there is more than one part, such as two eyes (**los ojos**).
- **Remember:** Practising your pronunciation out loud makes the new Spanish words stick in your memory!

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, nouns have a 'gender'. We use 'el' or 'los' for masculine words (like 'el brazo') and 'la' or 'las' for feminine words (like 'la boca'). Rosa the parrot says this is like sorting words into different colourful nests!
