

Rosa's Body Parts Challenge

Learning objective: To identify and spell common body parts in Spanish and use them in simple sentences.

Read the passage about Rosa the parrot and her friends. Use the word bank to help you complete the questions below.

¡Hola! My name is Rosa, and I love to dance. When I dance, I move my body to the music. I have a yellow head (la cabeza) and very sharp eyes (los ojos). My friend Max the monkey has two big ears (las orejas) and two small hands (las manos). When we play football, we use our feet (los pies). It is fun to learn the names of our body parts in Spanish! Remember: if you have something, you can say 'Tengo'. For example, 'Tengo dos ojos' means 'I have two eyes'.

Word bank: la cabeza (head) · los ojos (eyes) · las manos (hands) · los pies (feet) · la nariz (nose) · las orejas (ears) · tengo (I have) · grande (big) · pequeño (small)

1. Using the passage, write the Spanish word for 'head'. (1 mark)

2. If Max has two feet, how would you write that in Spanish using the word 'Tengo'? (2 marks)

3. Which two body parts does Rosa mention that she has, and what do they mean in English? (2 marks)

4. Translate the phrase 'Tengo una nariz' into English. (2 marks)

5. Look at the word 'grande'. If a giant has a 'grande' head, what does 'grande' mean in English? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a funny self-portrait. Label at least four body parts in Spanish using the labels from the word bank.



Extension challenge: Write a short poem in English about your body parts, but replace the English names with the Spanish words you have learnt today.
