

Spanish Body Parts with Rosa the Parrot

Learning objective: To identify and recall common body parts in Spanish and apply them to simple descriptive sentences.

Help Rosa the Parrot label the bird anatomy and use your vocabulary to complete the sentences. Remember to use 'la' for feminine nouns and 'el' for masculine nouns.

Rosa the Parrot is getting ready for her morning flight! She needs your help to label her features so she can teach her friends how to describe themselves in Spanish.

Word bank: la cabeza (head) · el ojo (eye) · la ala (wing) · la pata (leg/foot) · el pico (beak) · el cuerpo (body)

1. Rosa points to her beak. Write the correct Spanish term for 'beak' from the word bank. (1 mark)

2. If Rosa has two eyes, translate the phrase 'the eye' into Spanish using the correct article (el or la). (1 mark)

3. Match the Spanish word 'la pata' to its English meaning. Why is 'la' used instead of 'el' here? (2 marks)

4. Complete this sentence: 'El pájaro tiene una cabeza.' What does this sentence mean in English? (2 marks)

5. Rosa wants to describe her wing. Write a short sentence in Spanish using 'la ala'. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of a parrot and draw lines from the labels 'la cabeza', 'el pico', and 'la ala' to the correct parts of your drawing.



Extension challenge: Research one more body part in Spanish (for example, 'la cola' for tail) and write a sentence explaining how you would use it to describe a different animal.
