

Year 4 Spanish: The Vibrant World of Colours

Learning objective: To identify, spell, and apply Spanish colour vocabulary to descriptions of the natural world.

Read each question carefully. Ensure you check your spelling in Spanish, including any necessary accents. Rosa the parrot is cheering you on—buena suerte!

Rosa the parrot is painting a mural of the jungle. She has a palette with many bright colours. She uses 'amarillo' for the sun, 'verde' for the deep leaves, and 'rojo' for the tropical flowers. She carefully mixes 'azul' and 'rojo' to create a beautiful 'morado' for the evening sky.

1. Translate the following colours into Spanish: 1. Green, 2. Yellow, 3. Black, 4. White. (4 marks)

2. If Rosa has a pencil case costing £3.50 and she buys a set of paints for £4.25, how much does she spend in total? Write the total in words in Spanish. (3 marks)

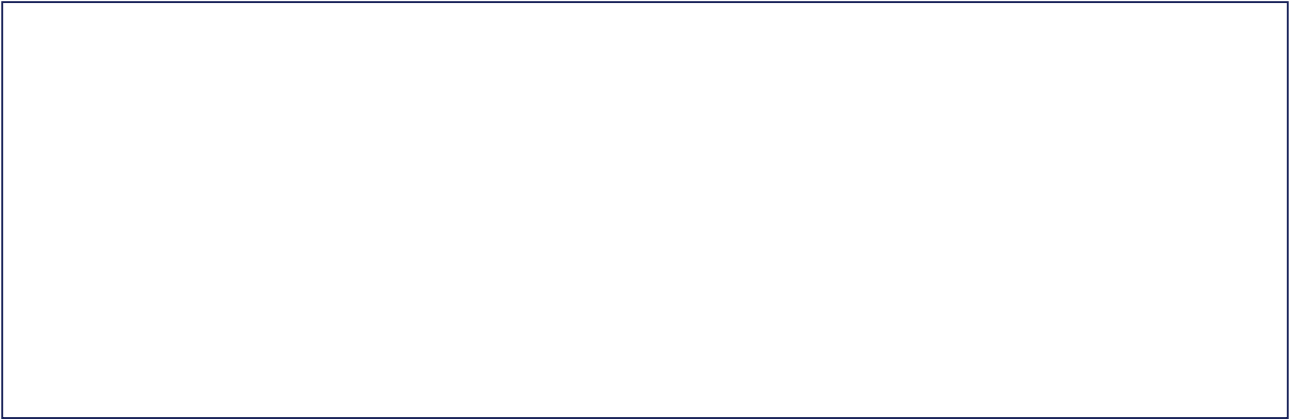
3. Explain why Spanish adjectives regarding colour must match the noun they describe (e.g., el libro rojo vs. la mesa roja). Provide an example of your own. (4 marks)

4. Compare and contrast the colours of a typical forest in autumn versus spring. Use at least four Spanish colour words in your comparison. (4 marks)

5. Justify your answer: If you were painting an underwater scene for Finn the dolphin, which three colours would be the most important to include and why? (5 marks)

6. What might happen if all the colours in the world turned into 'gris'? Write two sentences in Spanish describing how this would change your favourite object. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of a magical garden featuring at least five different colours. Label each object in your garden using the correct Spanish colour word (e.g., 'el árbol verde').



Extension challenge: Total: /25. Imagine you are an artist. Write a short paragraph (50-70 words) in Spanish describing your dream landscape. Use at least six colours and justify your choice of colour palette based on the mood you want to create.
