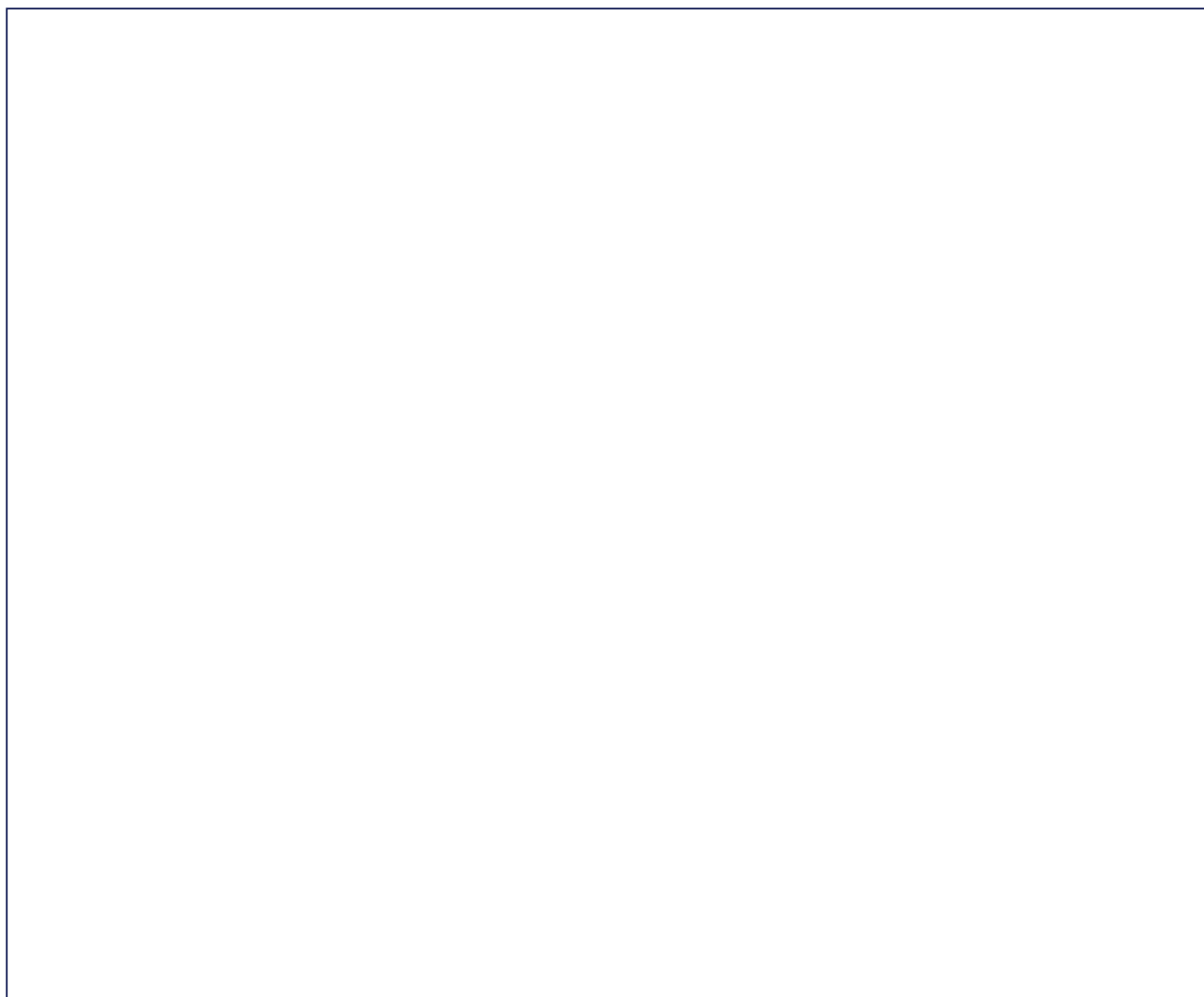


Rosa's Weekly Spanish Planner

Learning objective: To learn and use the days of the week in Spanish through creative illustration.

Rosa the parrot has a very busy week ahead! Use the word bank to label each of the seven sections on your drawing. Draw an activity that Rosa might do on each day of the week to help you remember the Spanish words.

Draw: Draw a large circle in the middle of your page and divide it into seven equal 'pizza slices' to create a weekly clock. In each slice, write one of the Spanish days of the week from the word bank. Inside each slice, draw a small, simple picture representing an activity for that day (for example, a book for reading on 'lunes' or a star for stargazing on 'viernes'). Use bright colours to make your planner stand out!



Label words: lunes (Monday) · martes (Tuesday) · miércoles (Wednesday) · jueves (Thursday) · viernes (Friday) · sábado (Saturday) · domingo (Sunday)

Steps:

1. Write the Spanish word for the day that comes after 'martes'.
2. If today is 'lunes', what day is tomorrow in Spanish?
3. Which two days make up the weekend? Label them in Spanish.
4. Rosa likes to study on 'jueves'. What day is that in English?

5. Fill in the blank: 'Miércoles' comes between 'martes' and _____.
