

Mi Familia: Meeting the Family with Rosa the Parrot

¡Hola! Join Rosa the parrot on a colourful journey to learn all about the special people in our lives in Spanish!

- To introduce your mother in Spanish, you say 'Mi madre se llama...' followed by her name.
- If you have a brother, you use the phrase 'Tengo un hermano'.
- Grandparents are very important: 'el abuelo' is your grandfather and 'la abuela' is your grandmother.
- When talking about more than one sister, you use the plural 'las hermanas'.
- Using 'Tengo' allows you to tell others how many siblings you have, for example: 'Tengo dos hermanos' (I have two brothers).

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, family names change slightly depending on the gender of the person! Words ending in 'o' usually refer to males, while words ending in 'a' refer to females. It is like a secret code for your family tree!
