

Spanish Family Vocabulary: ¡Mi Familia!

Learning objective: To learn and apply Spanish vocabulary for family members and describe family relationships using possessive pronouns.

Read the questions carefully and use the vocabulary bank to help you complete the tasks. Rosa the parrot is here to help you practise your Spanish pronunciation!

Word bank: la madre (mother) · el padre (father) · el hermano (brother) · la hermana (sister) · el abuelo (grandfather) · la abuela (grandmother) · mi (my) · tengo (I have) · se llama (is called)

1. Translate the following sentences into Spanish: 'My mother is called Maria' and 'I have one brother'. (2 marks)

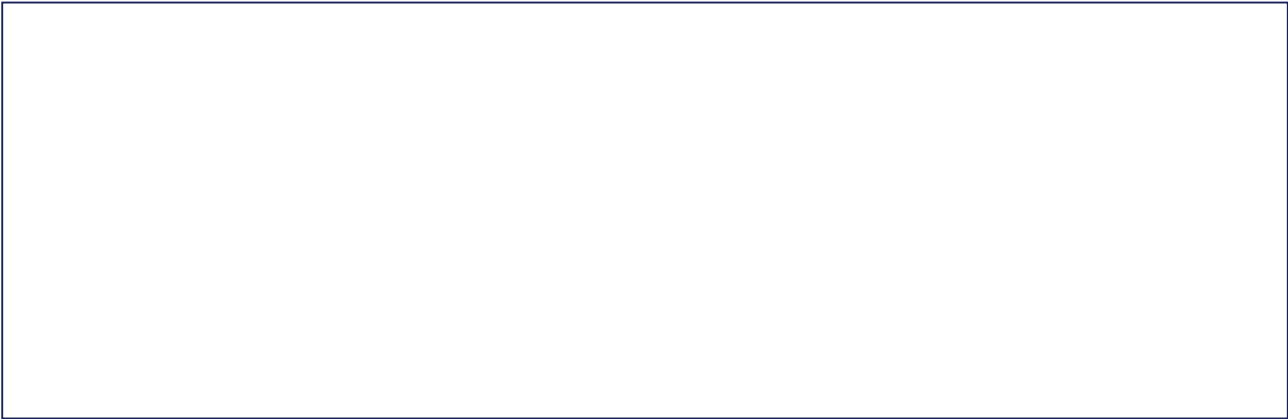
2. If you were introducing your grandmother to Rosa the parrot, what Spanish phrase would you use? Write the sentence down. (2 marks)

3. Look at these two words: 'el hermano' and 'la hermana'. Why do the articles (el/la) change? (2 marks)

4. Write a short sentence in Spanish about a family member of your choice using 'Mi... se llama...'. (2 marks)

5. If you have two sisters, how would you say 'I have two sisters' in Spanish? (Hint: use the word 'dos' for two). (2 marks)

Draw: Draw your own family tree. Next to each person, write their name and their Spanish family title (e.g., 'Mi abuela, Elena').



Extension challenge: Research and write down the Spanish words for 'aunt' (tía) and 'uncle' (tío). Write one sentence for each using the structure 'Mi tía se llama...'
