

Rosa's Spanish Food Fiesta

Learning objective: To identify and use common Spanish food vocabulary and understand how to express preferences using 'Me gusta' and 'No me gusta'.

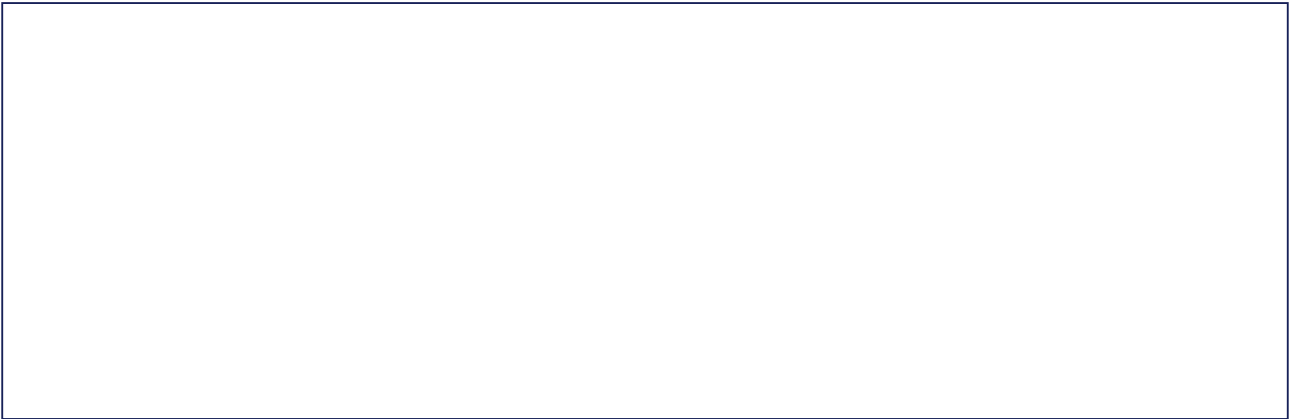
7. 7. True or False: 'El queso' is a type of dairy product. (1 mark)

9. 9. Explain why it is important to use 'Me gusta' versus 'No me gusta' when ordering food at a restaurant. (1 mark)

10. 10. Greater Depth: Compare the use of 'Me gusta' with 'Me gustan'. Justify when you would add the 'n' to the end of 'gusta'. (1 mark)
