

Rosa's Spanish Café: Comida y Bebida

Learning objective: To identify and use common Spanish vocabulary for food and drink, and to express likes and dislikes using 'Me gusta' and 'No me gusta'.

Read the café menu description below, study the word bank, and complete the questions to help Rosa the parrot organise her café orders.

Rosa the parrot has opened a small café for her friends in the forest. Every morning, she prepares fresh snacks. '¡Hola!' says Rosa. 'For breakfast, I have fresh bread with cheese. For a healthy snack, I always serve a crunchy apple. If you are thirsty, you can choose between cool water, sweet juice, or creamy milk.' Max the monkey visits the café and says, 'Me gusta el queso, but no me gusta el zumo.' Finn the dolphin stops by and says, 'Me gusta el agua, but no me gusta la leche.'

Word bank: la manzana (apple) · el pan (bread) · el queso (cheese) · el agua (water) · el zumo (juice) · la leche (milk) · Me gusta (I like) · No me gusta (I do not like)

1. Based on the passage, what two items does Max the monkey like and dislike? (2 marks)

2. Translate the following sentence into English: 'Me gusta la manzana.' (1 mark)

3. If you were at Rosa's café, which drink would you choose? Write your answer in Spanish using the phrase 'Me gusta...' (1 mark)

4. Why do you think Rosa serves bread with cheese? Use the word bank to help you identify the Spanish words. (2 marks)

5. If a slice of bread costs 50p and a piece of cheese costs 40p, how much would a cheese sandwich cost in total? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a picture of your favourite meal on a plate. Label at least three items on your plate using the Spanish words from the word bank.



Extension challenge: Write a short dialogue in Spanish between you and Rosa. Ask her if she likes a specific food, and have her respond using 'Sí, me gusta' or 'No, no me gusta'.
