

Rosa's Spanish Greeting Guide

Learning objective: To learn and apply common Spanish greetings and introductions appropriate for different times of the day.

Join Rosa the parrot on a linguistic adventure! Use this guide to practise how to greet friends and adults in Spanish. Fill in the boxes below by choosing the correct phrases from the word bank. Make sure you match the time of day to the right greeting!

Word bank: ¡Hola! · Buenos días · Buenas tardes · Buenas noches · Adiós · Me llamo... · Encantado/a

1. Morning Greetings: Rosa greets her friends when the sun first rises. Which phrase should she use before midday? (2 marks)

2. Afternoon Manners: If it is past 12:00 pm, which Spanish greeting is polite to use? (2 marks)

3. Evening Farewells: When the stars come out, what do you say to wish someone a good night? (2 marks)

4. Introducing Yourself: If you meet a new friend, how do you tell them your name in Spanish? (2 marks)

5. Polite Conversation: After learning someone's name, why is it important to say 'Encantado/a' (Pleased to meet you)? (3 marks)

Extension challenge: Imagine you are meeting a new Spanish-speaking pen pal. Write a short script using at least three different greetings from your word bank to start a conversation.
