

Spanish Numbers Assessment: Year 4

Learning objective: To read, write, and understand Spanish numbers from 0 to 20.

Hello! I am Rosa the parrot. Let's show what you know about Spanish numbers! Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you get stuck. Write your answers clearly on the lines provided.

Rosa the parrot is counting her favourite shiny objects in her nest.

2. 2. Write the Spanish word for the number 12. (2 marks)

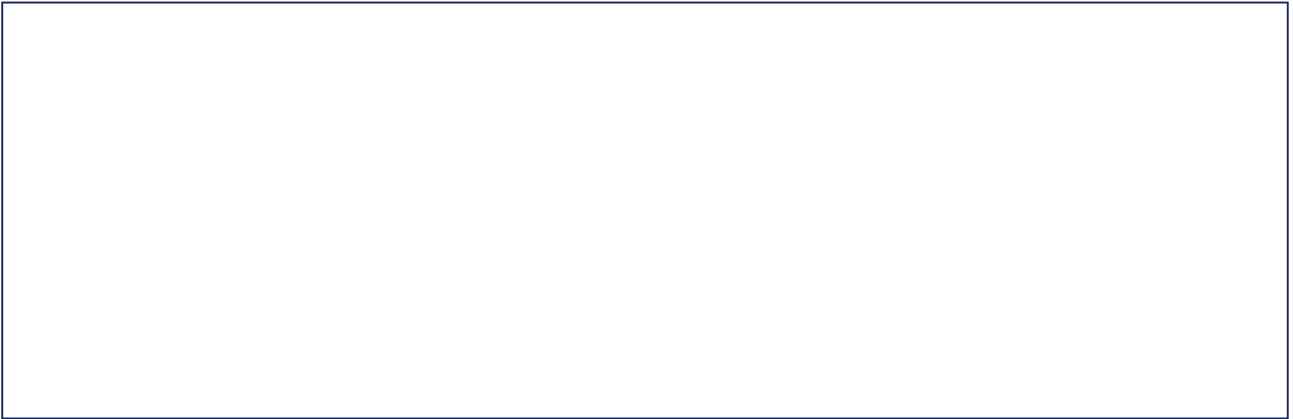
3. 3. Rosa has 8 acorns and 7 feathers. How many items does she have in total? Write the answer in Spanish. (4 marks)

4. 4. Match the number to the Spanish word by drawing a line: 3 = tres, 10 = diez, 20 = veinte. (Write your matches here:) (6 marks)

5. 5. Rosa sees 16 colourful beads. Write the number 16 in Spanish and use it in a short sentence. Sentence starter: Rosa has... (6 marks)

6. 6. Extended Writing: Rosa is hosting a party for her friends. She needs to count out 20 seeds for her guests. Write a short story about Rosa counting the seeds from 'uno' to 'veinte'. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw 4 apples and 6 oranges next to Rosa. Label them with the correct Spanish numbers.
