

Rosa's Spanish Number Fact-File

Learning objective: To recall and use numbers 1-20 in Spanish and apply them to simple calculations and shopping scenarios.

Help Rosa the parrot organise her Spanish market stall! Use your knowledge of Spanish numbers to fill out the fact-file. For the final questions, show your working out in pounds (£) and include the Spanish number words for your answers.

Word bank: uno · dos · tres · cuatro · cinco · seis · siete · ocho · nueve · diez · once · doce · trece · catorce · quince · dieciséis · diecisiete · dieciocho · diecinueve · veinte

1. Number Translation: Choose three numbers between 11 and 20. Write the digit and the Spanish word for each one. (3 marks)

2. Market Maths: If a bunch of grapes costs £3 (tres libras) and a melon costs £5 (cinco libras), what is the total cost in pounds? Write your answer in both digits and Spanish words. (2 marks)

3. Explain why it is important to know the correct spelling of numbers in Spanish when visiting a market in a Spanish-speaking country. (3 marks)

4. Compare and contrast: How is the number 16 (dieciséis) constructed compared to the number 12 (doce)? Look for the pattern in the Spanish language. (3 marks)

5. Justify your answer: If you have £20 (veinte libras) and want to buy four items that cost £4 each, will you have enough money? Explain your reasoning. (4 marks)

6. What might happen if you accidentally wrote 'diez' instead of 'dieciséis' on a price tag for a basket of apples? (3 marks)

Extension challenge: Creative Challenge: Write a short, original dialogue between a customer and a shopkeeper using at least four different Spanish number words to discuss the prices of fruit.
