

¡Los Números! Rosa's Spanish Number Guide

Count along with Rosa the Parrot—¡Vamos a contar!

- The number 0 is written as 'cero' in Spanish.
- The numbers 1 to 5 are 'uno', 'dos', 'tres', 'cuatro', and 'cinco'.
- The number 10 is 'diez', and 20 is 'veinte'.
- Numbers 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15 are 'once', 'doce', 'trece', 'catorce', and 'quince'.
- Spanish numbers 16 through 19 use the prefix 'dieci-' followed by the base number.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, numbers 16 to 19 are formed by combining 'diez' (ten) with the other number. For example, 16 is 'dieciséis', which literally translates to 'ten and six'!
