

Rosa's Spanish Number Adventure

Learning objective: To read, write, and use Spanish numbers from 1 to 50 accurately.

Join Rosa the parrot as she practises her Spanish numbers! Read the questions carefully and use the word bank to help you complete the tasks. Remember to look for patterns in the Spanish number system.

Word bank: uno (1), dos (2), tres (3), cuatro (4), cinco (5) · diez (10), veinte (20), treinta (30), cuarenta (40), cincuenta (50) · y (and) · veintiuno (21), veintidós (22)

1. Rosa is counting her colourful feathers. Write the Spanish word for the following numbers: 7, 12, and 15. (3 marks)

2. Max the monkey is counting his collection of shiny pebbles. He has 34 pebbles. How would he say this number in Spanish? (Hint: Think about how to combine 'treinta' and 'cuatro'). (2 marks)

3. If a notebook costs £25, how would you write the number 25 in Spanish? (1 mark)

4. Translate this sequence into numbers: 'diez, veinte, treinta, cuarenta'. What is the next number in this pattern in Spanish? (2 marks)

5. Zara is painting stripes. She has painted 48 stripes. Write 48 as a Spanish word. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a basket containing a specific number of items (between 30 and 50) and write the number in Spanish underneath your drawing.



Extension challenge: Choose two numbers between 1 and 50 and write a simple Spanish addition sum (e.g., 'diez + cinco = quince'). Can you create three more sums for a friend to solve?
