

Rosa's Market Adventure: A Spanish Shopping Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and polite transactions in a market setting.

Read each question carefully. Rosa is visiting a Spanish market to buy ingredients for a picnic. Answer in the requested language (Spanish or English) as indicated.

Rosa the parrot is at the local market. She wants to buy fruit, bread, and cheese. The stallholder is friendly, and Rosa uses her best manners to ask for the prices of her items. She has a budget of £20 to spend for her friends.

1. Rosa wants to ask the price of an apple. Write the Spanish phrase she should use. (2 marks)

2. Translate the following into English: 'El pan cuesta dos libras'. (2 marks)

3. If an item costs £10, would you describe it as 'barato' or 'caro'? Explain your reasoning using your knowledge of Spanish vocabulary. (3 marks)

4. Rosa buys cheese for £4 and bread for £3. Calculate the total cost in pounds (£). Show your working. (3 marks)

5. Compare and contrast the experience of shopping in a small market versus a large supermarket. Which do you think is better for the environment and why? (4 marks)

6. Justify why it is important to use polite phrases like 'por favor' and 'gracias' when interacting with shopkeepers in a foreign country. (3 marks)

7. Extended Writing Task: Rosa has £20. She wants to buy three different items. List your chosen items in Spanish, state the price of each in pounds, calculate the total spend, and write a short dialogue (in Spanish with English translations) of the interaction between Rosa and the stallholder. (5 marks) (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a colourful market stall owned by Rosa the parrot, showing at least three items for sale with their prices labelled in Spanish.
