

Year 4 Spanish: Shopping Assessment

Learning objective: To identify Spanish vocabulary for shopping, prices, and simple polite phrases.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you. Write your answers in Spanish or English as requested.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a local market. She wants to buy a healthy snack and a gift for her friends.

Word bank: la tienda (the shop) · ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much does it cost?) · el euro (the euro) · la manzana (the apple) · el libro (the book) · caro (expensive) · barato (cheap) · por favor (please) · gracias (thank you)

1. Rosa wants to ask the shopkeeper for the price of an item. How do you say 'How much does it cost?' in Spanish? (2 marks)

2. Rosa buys an apple. Write the Spanish word for 'the apple' below. (2 marks)

3. The shopkeeper says the book costs 5 euros. Write the number 5 in Spanish words. (2 marks)

4. If an item costs very little money, we call it 'barato'. If it costs a lot of money, we call it 'caro'. If a toy costs £1, is it 'barato' or 'caro'? (4 marks)

5. Rosa buys a book. Write two polite phrases she should use when shopping. (4 marks)

6. Extended Writing: Imagine you are at a market. You want to buy a book for £4. Write a short conversation (3-4 sentences) between you and the shopkeeper. Use the words from your word bank. (11 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Rosa the parrot in a shop. Show an apple and a book on the counter.
