Learning objective: To learn and apply key Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and food items in a market setting.

Rosa the parrot has flown to a bustling Spanish market! Use these flashcards to help her practise buying fresh ingredients. Read the term or question, then check the answer on the right.

¿Cuánto cuesta?	La manzana
How much does it cost?	The apple
El pan	Caro
The bread	Expensive
Barato	La moneda
Cheap	The coin
La tienda	La lista de la compra
The shop	The shopping list
Por favor	Rosa says: 'La fruta es tres libras.' What does this mean?
Please	The fruit is three pounds (£3).
Explain why it is useful to know the phrase '¿Cuánto cuesta?' when visiting a market in Spain.	Compare and contrast the words 'caro' and 'barato'. How might these influence a shopper's decision?
It allows a shopper to ask for the price of an item, enabling them to budget their money effectively.	'Caro' means expensive and 'barato' means cheap. A shopper might choose to buy 'barato' items to save money or purchase more items for their budget.
