

Rosa's Spanish Market Day

Learning objective: To use Spanish vocabulary for shopping, prices, and quantities to role-play a market transaction.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a bustling market in Spain! Use this template to plan your own shopping trip. Write your items in Spanish, calculate the total cost in pounds, and explain your choices to demonstrate your understanding of Spanish currency and vocabulary.

Word bank: ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much does it cost?) · La manzana (apple) · El plátano (banana) · El pan (bread) · El queso (cheese) · Cuesta... (It costs...) · Quisiera... (I would like...) · Gracias (Thank you)

1. Shopping List: List three items you wish to buy at the market. Write them in Spanish and include the price for each item in £. (3 marks)

2. The Transaction: Write a short dialogue in Spanish where you ask the shopkeeper for one of your items and they tell you the price. (4 marks)

3. Total Calculation: If you bought all three items on your list, what is the total cost in £? Show your working out. (2 marks)

4. Explain why you chose these specific items for your basket. Consider the nutritional value or the practicality of your choices. (3 marks)

5. Compare and contrast: How is shopping at a small local market different from shopping at a large supermarket? Justify your preference. (4 marks)

6. What might happen if you arrived at the market with only £2.00, but the items you wanted cost more? How would you adjust your plan using your Spanish vocabulary? (4 marks)

Extension challenge: Imagine you are the shopkeeper. Write a short 'Day in the Life' diary entry describing which items were the most popular today and why you think customers enjoyed buying them.
