

Rosa's Shopping Trip in Spain

Learning objective: To learn and use Spanish words for shopping and prices.

Read the story about Rosa the parrot. Use the word bank to help you answer the questions. Use the sentence starters to help you write your answers.

Rosa the parrot is at a sunny market in Spain. She wants to buy a snack. She sees a basket of red apples. She asks the shopkeeper, '¿Cuánto cuesta?'. The shopkeeper says, 'Cuesta un euro.' Rosa is happy. She also buys a loaf of bread for two euros. She loves shopping in Spanish!

Word bank: la fruta (fruit) · el pan (bread) · cuesta (it costs) · ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much is it?) · un euro (one euro) · dos euros (two euros)

1. Rosa asks the shopkeeper the price of the apple. Write the Spanish question she uses. (2 marks)

2. How much does the fruit cost? Start your answer with: The fruit costs... (2 marks)

3. How much does the bread cost? Start your answer with: The bread costs... (2 marks)

4. What are two things Rosa can buy at the market? Use the word bank to help you. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Rosa the parrot at the market. Draw an apple next to her and write 'un euro' underneath it.



Extension challenge: Imagine you are at the market. Choose one item you want to buy and write the price in Spanish using the word 'cuesta'.
