

Shopping at the Spanish Market with Rosa

Learning objective: To use vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and quantities in Spanish, and to apply them to real-world financial contexts using pounds (£).

Rosa the parrot is helping her friends at the local market. Read the price list and solve the problems below. Use your knowledge of Spanish numbers and shopping phrases to complete the challenges.

Market Price List: Apple (La manzana) £0.50, Banana (El plátano) £0.30, Bread (El pan) £1.20, Cheese (El queso) £3.50.

Word bank: ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much does it cost?) · Cuesta... (It costs...) · La manzana (£0.50) · El plátano (£0.30) · El pan (£1.20) · El queso (£3.50) · ¿Qué desea? (What would you like?) · Quisiera... (I would like...)

1. If Max buys two apples (dos manzanas) and one banana (un plátano), calculate the total cost in pounds. Write your answer in a full Spanish sentence using 'Cuesta...' (2 marks)

2. Explain why it is important to check the prices in the market before you say 'Quisiera...' to the shopkeeper. (2 marks)

3. Compare the cost of the bread and the cheese. Which item is more expensive and by how much? Show your working out. (3 marks)

4. If you have a £5.00 note and you buy the cheese, how much change should you receive? Write the answer as a number. (2 marks)

5. Justify your answer: If you wanted to buy five bananas, would £1.00 be enough money? Why or why not? (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a vibrant Spanish market stall featuring the items from the price list. Add speech bubbles for Rosa the parrot asking '¿Qué desea?' and a customer replying 'Quisiera...'



Extension challenge: What might happen if the prices in the market suddenly doubled? Write a short paragraph explaining how this would change your shopping list and the total amount of money you would need to bring to the market.
