Learning objective: To use and understand vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and food items in Spanish.

Help Rosa the parrot get ready for the market! Read the questions carefully and use your Spanish knowledge to select or write the correct answers.

Answer Key: 1. A, 2. B, 3. True, 4. False, 5. El pan, 6. C, 7. B, 8. True, 9. La manzana, 10. £5.00. Note: In Spanish, we use the Euro (€), but for our maths practice, we are converting the values to pounds (£).

7. 7. What is the Spanish word for 'apple'? A) El plátano B) La manzana* C) La naranja D) El limón (1 mark)

8. 8. True or False: If something is 'barato', it is a good bargain (cheap). (1 mark)

9. 9. If you are buying a piece of fruit that is red and crunchy, what are you buying? (Answer in Spanish) (1 mark)

10. 10. If an item costs 'cinco libras', how much is it in pounds? Write the amount using the £ symbol. (1 mark)
