

Rosa's Busy Day in Spain

Learning objective: To read and understand simple Spanish phrases about time and daily routines.

Read the story below carefully. Use the word bank to help you understand the Spanish words. Write your answers in the boxes provided.

Rosa the parrot lives in a sunny house in Spain. She loves to keep to a strict schedule. Every morning, Rosa wakes up early. She looks at the clock and asks, '¿Qué hora es?' It is 8:00 am. She says, 'Son las ocho.' It is time for her breakfast. Rosa eats fruit and sings songs. At 1:00 pm, she shouts, '¡Es la una!' This is the time for her delicious lunch. She enjoys a big plate of rice and vegetables. After lunch, Rosa likes to study. She reads her books until 4:00 pm, which is 'Son las cuatro.' Rosa finds that knowing the time helps her day run smoothly. She helps her friends learn to say the time in Spanish too. By the end of the day, Rosa is tired but happy. She knows exactly when to rest and when to play. Telling the time is a very useful skill for a clever parrot like Rosa!

1. What does Rosa eat for breakfast at 8:00 am? (1 mark)

2. At what time does Rosa have her lunch? (1 mark)

3. Why do you think Rosa keeps to a strict schedule? (2 marks)

4. How does Rosa feel at the end of the day? How do you know? (2 marks)

5. Do you think it is important to know how to tell the time? Why? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a clock showing 4:00 pm and draw Rosa the parrot sitting next to it with her favourite book.



Extension challenge: Try to write three sentences about what you do at different times of the day using the Spanish phrases you learned today.
