

Rosa's Transport Adventure: El Transporte

Learning objective: To learn and apply Spanish vocabulary for different modes of transport and express how you travel using 'voy en'.

Welcome to Rosa the parrot's language lesson! Use the word bank to help you answer these questions about transport. Remember to use 'voy en' (I go by) before the mode of transport.

Word bank: el coche (car) · el autobús (bus) · el tren (train) · el avión (aeroplane) · la bicicleta (bicycle) · el barco (boat) · a pie (on foot)

1. Rosa is flying to Spain. Which mode of transport is she using? Write your answer in Spanish. (1 mark)

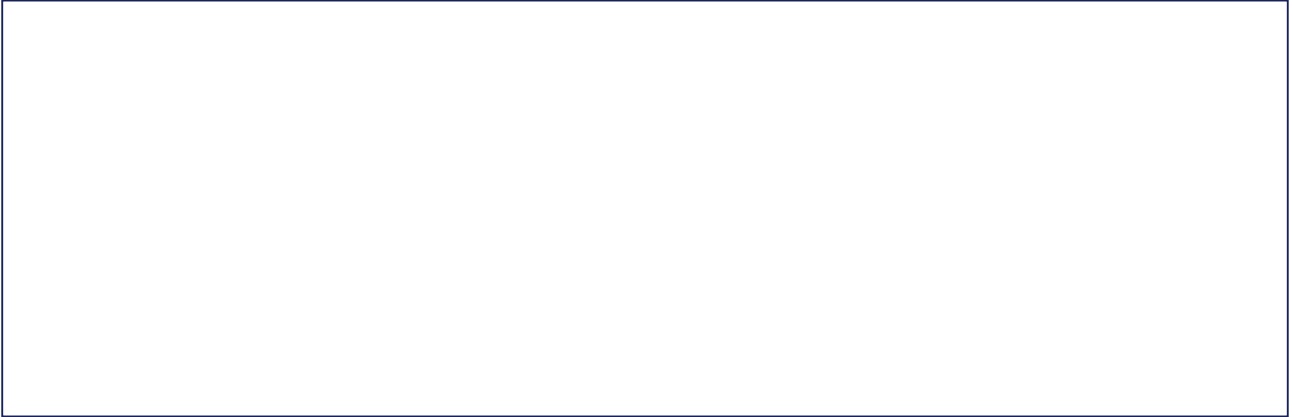
2. Max the monkey wants to ride his bike to the park. Write a full sentence in Spanish to say: 'I go by bicycle'. (2 marks)

3. If a train ticket costs £12.50 and a bus ticket costs £4.25, how much more does the train cost than the bus? Show your working out. (2 marks)

4. Translate these two sentences into English: 'Voy en autobús' and 'Voy en barco'. (2 marks)

5. If you travel to school by walking, how would you say that in Spanish using the phrase 'a pie'? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a picture of your favourite way to travel. Beneath your drawing, write a label in Spanish saying 'Voy en...' followed by your chosen mode of transport.



Extension challenge: Research one Spanish-speaking country. Can you find out which mode of transport is most popular there and write one sentence in Spanish about it?
