

Sheet 14: How the Writer Builds Character

Worked example:

Read this: 'Max adjusted his glasses, carefully sorting the counting cubes into perfect rows of ten.' What does this tell us about Max? Choose one: A) He is lazy, B) He loves order and maths.

Answer: B) He loves order and maths, because he is sorting cubes into groups.

- **Read this description of Pip: 'Pip hunched over the tiny dictionary, his magnifying glass hovering as he scribbled a new word onto his leaf-journal.'**

What does Pip's action tell you about his hobby? Which word in the text suggests he is very focused?

- **If a writer describes Nova the owl as 'carefully adjusting her telescope while whispering secrets to the stars', what personality trait are they building?**
